



SFI Fellowship Objectives

- Provide applicants interested in pursuing a career in research administration with experience of the duties and activities involved in such organisations.
- Provide applicants considering a transition from academia to the private sector and/or the public sector, with relevant experiences and skills.
- Provide applicants interested in pursuing a career in academic research with a holistic overview and understanding of a funding agency.
- Provide applicants with an interest in public engagement an opportunity to gain experience in education and public engagement within a funding agency.
- Provide applicants with relevant experience and skills in research policy and strategic development and implementation.
- Enhance knowledge transfer between SFI and its partner organisations

Programme Structure



- Up to a period of 24 months on a full-time, continuous basis
- Two one-year placements across SFI Directorates
- Fellows will also be assigned to an SFI Supervisor who will provide support and guidance to the Fellow for the duration of the Fellowship Programme.
- A personal development plan will be agreed with the SFI Supervisor and will be reviewed periodically during the placement.
- Training will be provided both on commencement and throughout the duration of the Fellowship
- Successful Fellows will be recognised as an employee of their current Research Body for the duration of the Fellowship grant.
- All terms and conditions associated with the Fellow's Contract of Employment with their Research Body will apply.
- Placement agreement signed by the Research Body and Science Foundation Ireland prior to commencement of the placement.







Divisions/Teams

- The Research Centres team is responsible for SFI's flagship programme which funds 16 world-leading SFI Research Centres.
- The Enterprise Partnerships team drives engagement with stakeholders to facilitate opportunities for national and international funders, philanthropic organisations and enterprises to foster research and innovation in partnership with academic researchers.
- The **Individual-led research (ILR)** team manages a number of key programmes; e.g. the Frontiers for the Future, many of which are focused on supporting excellent independent researchers.
- SFI Education and Public Engagement (EPE) team manages initiatives that support a range of activity including funding projects nationwide, through the SFI Discover Funding Programme, that support STEM public engagement.

- The SFI Challenge Research team is responsible for the development and delivery of challenge-based funding opportunities for SFI.
- The Strategy team supports the Director General in the development and implementation of SFI's strategy, Shaping Our Future and in overseeing and monitoring SFI's overall performance.
- **SFI International** helps develop global research cooperation for Irish researchers to cooperate with the best from academia and industry across Europe and worldwide.
- The Corporate Communications team has responsibility for the design, development, and delivery of SFI's marketing and communications strategy.
- The **Research Policy** team manages the development and implementation of evidence-based policy which supports strong research governance across all SFI programmes.



Eligibility criteria

- Applicants must:
 - Hold a PhD or equivalent in a STEM discipline.
 - Be on a research contract in an eligible Irish Research Body at the time of application.
 - Be in a position to take a period of 24 months (continuous and full-time) away from their current research activities within the Research Body, starting in October 2023.
 - Have a right to work in Ireland with a work visa/ permit (if applicable) for the duration of the SFI Fellowship placement.
- Researchers/scientists who are employed under a Contract of Indefinite Duration are not permitted to apply.
- Previous successful applicants to the SFI Fellowship Programme are not eligible to apply.

Line Manager

- Applicants must have the support of a Line Manager within their research body (academic member of staff)
- Takes administrative responsibility for the Fellow if the applicant is successful, arranging salary, leave entitlements and other administrative duties for the Fellow within the Research Body while the Fellow is participating in the Fellowship Programme



Eligible Costs- Salary

- Salary Contributions
 - SFI Team Members Salary Scales (Level 2A Point 1 to Level 2B Point 4)

 - The current salary of the applicant must be indicated on the Application Form which is endorsed by the Research Body.
 - Applicants will be entitled to one increment increase for months 13-24 of the Fellowship Programme, subject to the maximum of point 6 for Level 2A and point 4 for Level 2B.
- Overheads are payable as a contribution to the Research Body
 - Should not be included in the requested budget to cover costs incurred directly as a result of the Fellowship award.



Application Procedure

- Not on SFI's grant management system SESAME
- To apply to the programme, the following documents should be completed and submitted as a single pdf to <u>fellowship@sfi.ie</u> by 1pm 16 May 2023
 - 1. Application Form (Appendix 2)
 - Research Integrity
 - Requested Salary
 - Details of Line Manager
 - Research Body Signature
 - Applicant signature
 - 2. CV (max. 2 pages)
 - 3. Personal Statement (max. 2 pages)
 - 4. Letter of Support (max. 2 pages)
 - **Line Manager**: confirming that they will take administrative responsibility for the Fellow if the applicant is successful





Selection Process

Review Criteria

- Motivation of the applicant for participating in the Fellowship.
- Suitability of the applicant for the Fellowship taking key competencies into consideration. These
 may include problem solving and communication skills, teamwork, innovation and creativity, and
 organisational skills.
- Following confirmation of eligibility, candidates will be shortlisted by SFI, and suitable applicants will be invited to attend an interview.
- Candidates invited for interview will undergo a competency-based interview process
- SFI expects that candidates who are invited for interview will have a high-level understanding of SFI's mission and purpose and will be able to articulate their motivation for the Fellowship
- Typically a 30-40 minute interview via Zoom, indicative interview dates in early June 2023*

Successful applicants



• After the interview stage applicants recommended for the Fellowship will be approved for funding by the SFI Executive Interview • Successful applicants informed with indicative start date and details on 1st Rotation • Supply contact details of two referees Reference • Subject to the successful completion of the reference checks research grant/award (letter of offer) and Placement Agreement are issued to the VP Research of the applicant's Research Body- need to be returned to SFI • Depending on policy within Research Body, the nominated Line Manager/VP Research liaises with internal Research Body HR to initiate contract process • All incoming Fellows start placement at the same time (October 2023)

Deadline for Applications: 16 May 2023 @ 1pm

- Strategy documents such as IMPACT 2030 and Shaping our Future
